On March 30, 1993, a hearing was held in the above-captioned matter. Applicant was not present nor was he represented at the hearing. The Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") was represented by Assistant Attorney General Mark Sendrow.

Based upon the evidence and arguments presented at the hearing, the Director and the Hearing Officer make the following findings of fact and conclusions of law and enter the following order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Notice of this hearing was mailed to Applicant at his last address of record.
2. On or about September 2, 1993, Applicant submitted an application for insurance license to the Department.
3. On or about December 3, 1993, the Department denied Applicant's application. A second notice of denial dated January 12, 1994 was also mailed to Applicant.
4. In the application, December was asked, "Have you ever been refused an insurance, securities, or other license by a public authority of any jurisdiction; and has any such license, if issued to you, ever been suspended or revoked?" Decker answered "No" to the question.

1 5. On or about March 27, 1986, Applicant entered into
2 a Consent Order In the Matter of Alfred G. Decker, License No.
3 0148329, Arizona Department of Insurance Docket No. 6085. In
4 the Consent Order the Director of the Department revoked
5 Applicant's insurance license for violations of A.R.S.
6 §20-316(A)(7).

7 6. On or about December 17, 1993, Applicant requested
8 a hearing based on the denial.

9 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

10 1. The Director has jurisdiction in this matter
11 pursuant to A.R.S. §20-142.

12 2. Notice of this hearing was property pursuant to
13 A.R.S. §§20-163 and 41-1061.

14 3. Applicant wilfully misrepresented facts required to
15 be disclosed in an application, in violation of A.R.S. §20-291(G).

16 4. Grounds exist to deny Petitioner's insurance
17 license application pursuant to A.R.S. §§20-290(B)(1),
18 20-290(B)(2) and 20-291(G).

19 ORDER

20 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

21 Petitioner's application for a property and casualty
22 insurance agent's license is denied.

23 The aggrieved party may request a rehearing with
24 respect to this Order by filing a written petition with the




